Fishermans Beach - Darian Road Torquay

FORESHORE UPGRADE WORKS

KEY PROJECT OBJECTIVES The foreshore car park at the end of Darian Road, Torquay provides for public beach parking and access to the Torquay Sailing Club. The redevelopment of the car parking areas will be undertaken in accordance with the principles and recommendations of the Torquay Foreshore Master Plan and the Great Ocean Road Coast Committee's (GORCC's) Coastal Management Plan (CMP). The key design objectives for redevelopment of the car park include: • Provision of new BBQ and picnic facilities. • Create a large flat open grass kick-about area and improve picnic facilities on the coast side away from the road, by relocating the main car park closer to the Esplanade.

- Provision of dedicated disabled parking bays adjacent to the toilets and overlooking Zeally Bay.
 Potentian and recurfacing of popular lunchtime and
- Retention and resurfacing of popular lunchtime and off-peak parking areas with ocean views.
- Closure of the unsealed through road access to Cowrie Road to improve pedestrian safety on the foreshore path and at the toilet block.
- Establishment of vehicle control barriers and indigenous coastal revegetation along the Esplanade.
- Improvement of stormwater drainage incorporating Water Sensitive Urban Design (WSUD) principles.
- 'Realignment of the forestrore trail (Sun Coast Walk) to improve sightlines around the toilet block.
- Resurfacing of the steep access to the Torquay Sailing Club and retention of existing informal grass trailer parking areas.
