## Iconic Cafe Back in the Swing

Lorne's Swing Bridge Cafe will soon be back in business following the announcement of a successful tender.

The successful applicant, Lindsay Kingston, is the former owner of Geelong's Wintergarden Cafe, and has been a chef at Queenscliff's Vue Grand and Point Lonsdale's Kelp Cafe.

The public tender was advertised by the Great Ocean Road Coast Committee. The Committee's Chief Executive Officer Richard Davies said operations would commence in November and the cafe would be prepared for the coming peak season.

"We are delighted to announce this iconic venue will be reopening for the enjoyment of both residents and visitors," he said.

Mr Kingston, who resides in Breamlea, has big ideas for the little cafe and will focus on good, quality coffee and modern, fresh cafe menus.

"We will be sourcing fresh ingredients and local produce including local seafood, and the paddle boats will still be operating," he said.

Mr Davies said the lease had been expanded to allow for some changes to the venue.

"The lease now provides greater flexibility for opening periods during the year, rather than limiting operating days to peak holiday times.," he said.
